## On-Line Course Registration for 2017-2018

The portal will be open from Monday March 6, 2017 – Friday March 17, 2017.

- Students register online for their 2017-2018 courses. Directions can be found on the website under For Students > Guidance Office > Class Registration. [www.spectrumhighschool.org](http://www.spectrumhighschool.org)
- Guidance office will enter required courses. Required courses and elective choices should equal **36 units**.
- Students should **also enter four alternate choices** in order of preference.
- For students who need assistance or do not have access to a computer at home, members of the Spectrum High School guidance staff will be available on select days to assist them.
- **After completing your registration-print, sign and return-REQUEST SUMMARY Form to Guidance Office by Friday, March 17.**

*\*In signing the Request Summary form both the student and parent agree to remain enrolled in the courses requested for the duration of the term.*

## Campus Portal Planning Tools

### Academic Planner

The Academic Planner displays the student's assigned Academic Program and the courses the student has planned to take in each school year. Based on the assigned Academic Program, students must meet credit requirements, course requirements, test requirements and GPA requirements. The goal is to meet each requirement for each grade level-grades 9-12.

### Graduation Progress

The Graduation Progress tool allows student and parents/guardians a color-coded view of a student's progress toward the completion of an Academic Plan. The tab displays the student's assigned academic program, listing the total credit the student has received and planned in each credit type assigned to the academic plan.
