Academic Planner

The Academic Planner displays the student's assigned Academic Program and the courses the student has planned to take in each school year. Based on the assigned Academic Program, students must meet credit requirements, course requirements, test requirements and GPA requirements. The goal is to meet requirements for each grade level-grades 9-12.

Graduation Progress

The Graduation Progress tool allows student and parents/guardians a color-coded view of a student's progress toward the completion of an Academic Plan.
